FIRST the Early Learning Center is very important. We follow all New Albany-Floyd County school district safety procedures and drills. All volunteers must complete a background check and visitors are asked to always have their license or other picture identification that will be scanned for an identification sticker that must be worn at all times during your visit. We ask that all visitors enter through the main door (Door Number 1) for the security of the building. Emergency drills for fire are held monthly. Tornado and take cover drills, earthquake and intruder drills are all practiced quarterly. The drills are presented as learning experiences and described as ways to practice keeping safe. The purpose of the drills is to teach children to respond in a rapid, orderly and safe manner in emergency situations.

Our preschoolers learn that it is our job to keep them safe and they are learning their job to help keep it safe. Thank you for supporting us in our safety procedures.
